## Workshop overview

Uncover 100,000,000 years of history at the Yorkshire Museum in our **Discover: Prehistoric Yorkshire** workshop. Explore the museum and handle real objects from our collections to get an insight into life in Yorkshire during the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages. Afterwards create your own copy of the Star Carr pendant – one of the earliest pieces of decorative art found in Britain – or a make a cast of a bronze axe head using clay.

#### **Numbers**

Maximum group size of 34 pupils per workshop.

We can accommodate up to two groups from your school on a single day, with a maximum of 30 pupils per workshop (60 pupils in total).

#### **Session fees**

£7 per pupil. For groups of 22 or less, there is a flat fee of £154 per workshop.

This includes entry to the Yorkshire Museum should you wish to make a selfguided visit before or after your workshop.



## What to expect

During this session, pupils will:

- completing two discovery challenges.
  These will give pupils an insight into life at Star Carr a Mesolithic site of international significance as well as how life in Yorkshire changed between the Stone, Bronze, and Iron Ages.
- Get hands-on with replica and real artefacts using one of our Prehistory object boxes, which will shed light on what everyday life was like during the Mesolithic (Life at Star Carr), or how materials and technologies changed between the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages (From Stone, to Bronze, to Iron).
- Learn through play by creating a copy of one of the earliest pieces of Mesolithic art discovered in Britain (The Star Carr Pendant) or by creating a cast of a bronze axe head using clay (Secrets of Bronze).

Our **Discover: Prehistoric York** workshop is led by an expert member of our Learning Team.

You can select which Prehistory object box (Life at Star Carr or From Stone, to Bronze, to Iron) and play-based activity (The Star Carr Pendant or Secrets of Bronze) you would like us to deliver as part of your workshop during the booking process.

You will be sent a copy of our Discover: Prehistoric York Workshop Risk Assessment once a booking has been made.

Our **Discover: Prehistoric Yorkshire** workshop can be used to cover the following curriculum areas:

#### **Key Stage Two**

Pupils should be taught about:

 Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age This could include:

- Late neolithic huntergatherers and early famers
- Bronze Age religion, technology and travel
- Iron Age hill forts: tribal kingdoms, farming, art and culture
- A local history study

	Life at Star Carr This box uses a digital mural to transport pupils back to the Mesolithic. Children will handle replica objects made by experimental archaeologists at the University of York to discover what everyday life was like 11,300 years ago.	
	From Stone, to Bronze, to Iron This box contains objects from our collections that will give children an insight into how materials and technologies changed during the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages.
